Attendance builds habits for life

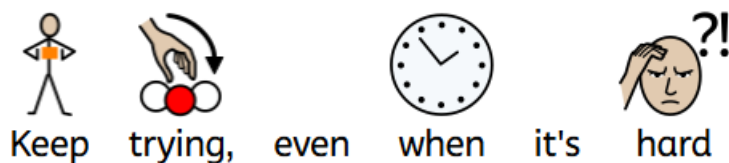
Attendance builds habits for life — coming to school every day helps children grow, learn, and develop strong routines that support them now and in the future.

Children learn how to:



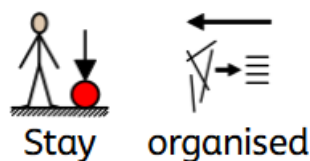
Build good habits

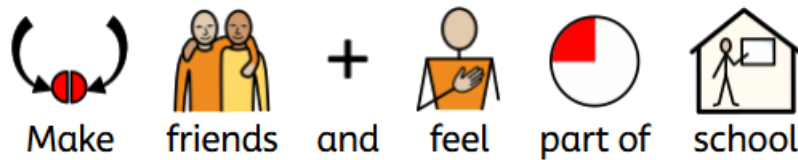

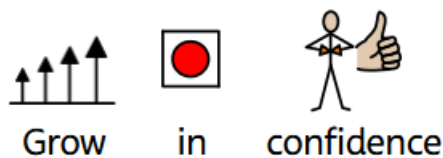
Coming to school every day helps children learn important skills that will support them now and in the future. When children come to school regularly and on time, they learn how to:
