### What is the PE and Sport Premium?

The PE and Sport Premium is government funding given to primary schools to help all children be more active and to improve the quality of PE and school sport. Schools must report how the money is spent and the impact it has.

### 1. Funding Received

Total PE & Sport Premium Grant for 2024–25: **£17,770**

### 2. How We Spent the Funding

We use the funding in three main areas: staff training (CPD), internal school activities, and external opportunities and competitions.

#### a) Staff Training (CPD)

Total spent: **£4,096.25**

## **3. How We Targeted the Funding**

### **Supporting pupils with SEND or medical needs**

Funding helped us to:

- provide inclusive PE training for staff
- use specialist coaches
- support SEND pupils in clubs and competitions
- develop youth leadership and peer-led activities
- improve data and understanding of individual needs

### **Increasing girls' participation in sport**

We invested in:

- girls-only activities or clubs

- competition opportunities
- community sports links
- leadership roles for girls

### **Supporting disadvantaged pupils (Pupil Premium)**

We used funding for:

- free after-school sports clubs
- parent engagement and communication
- youth leadership opportunities
- better insight into participation barriers

### **4. Impact of the Funding**

Across all areas, the impact was reported as **positive**.

#### **Impact on teaching and staff**

- Staff confidence and skills in teaching PE increased.
- Staff accessed high-quality coaching support.

#### **Impact on pupils**

- More pupils took part in regular physical activity.
- More children participated in sports clubs and competitions.
- The range of sports available broadened for all pupils.
- The profile of PE and sport increased across the school.

PE and sport contributed to improved wellbeing, engagement and school culture.

### **6. Sustainability of Improvements**

Funding has helped us:

- upskill our staff so improvements continue long-term
- embed inclusive sport practices across the school

- increase long-term participation in PE and clubs
