Sun Safety: Keeping Our Children Safe in Hot Weather

With the summer sunshine arriving, it's important that all children are protected during the school day. Please help us keep everyone safe by following these essential reminders:



Suncream

Apply sun cream before school A long-lasting, all-day sunscreen is ideal. Staff cannot apply sun cream, so applying it at home is vital.



Water bottle

Send a named water bottle every day Hydration is essential in warm weather. Children can refill bottles throughout the day.



Sun hat

Provide a sun hat A wide-brimmed or legionnaire-style hat offers the best protection for playtimes and outdoor learning.



Shade

Encourage shade-seeking habits We remind pupils to take breaks in shaded areas during lunchtime and outdoor activities. Please remind your child how important spending some time in the shade is.

School uniform is still required, but please help your child recognise when they are feeling too warm so they can remove their jumper or cardigan.
