Every child has the potential to achieve **100% attendance** for the year. It is important that your child starts their new school year with a good routine of attending school every day. Planning ahead and trying to ensure that your morning routines are organised is important

Useful reminders for the new school year

- Remember the school gates open at 8:45am.
- Please arrive before 8:55am.
- Help your child become independent and get them their own alarm clock. Set the alarm clock 5 minutes fast.
- Get everything ready the night before - uniform, school shoes, PE kit, water bottle, reading books and packed lunch.
- Don't allow the TV, computer games or mobile phones before everyone is ready - if at all.
- Come even earlier and join us for Early Bird (from 7:45am) and Breakfast Club (from 8:20am). Open every weekday in the hall.



September is a very important time for all children.

Getting into good habits in the first few weeks can massively improve your child's chances of being in school throughout the year.

Every school day counts, but every minute is equally important.



Be on time at ten to nine.

It is important to be on time as the first part of the school is used for morning learning activities, quiet reading and accelerated reader quiz taking. Persistent lateness has a significant detriment on children's learning and their start to the day.
